

POLITICAL CAMPAIGN SIGNS

Please use the following standards and regulations as a guide for the size and placement of campaign signs. Observing these guidelines will help maintain streetscapes that are safe, functional, and attractive to the community while enabling you to promote yourself as a candidate for public office.

- **Signs are prohibited on Federal, State, County or City owned property, including freeway ramps, power poles, street signs, regulatory signs, and park strips** (the public right-of-way between the curb and sidewalk or 10 ft. behind the curb if there is no sidewalk).
- **Signs may only be placed on private property.** Signs may not be placed on private property without the consent of the property owner.
- Signs are limited to 32 square feet in size and 6 feet in height.
- Signs may be placed at any time prior to the election.
- Please remove campaign signs as soon as possible following the election to avoid public nuisance issues and as a matter of courtesy.
- Signs may not be located within 150 feet of a building that serves as a polling place on Election Day per UCA 20A-3A-501. A polling place is any physical place where ballots and absentee ballots are cast, and includes the City offices during the period in which absentee (vote by mail) ballots are cast. Please refer to the map provided during the candidate orientation.
- Signs may not constitute a safety hazard, obstruct views, or create a nuisance.
- Signs should be no closer than 10 feet to a driveway and are not allowed within the “clear vision triangle” noted in the diagram.
- Signs which violate Kaysville City Code 17-33 Sign Regulations will be removed and thrown away.




Figure 1: No signs in the "No Build" and planter area.
