Kaysville City Manager Shayne Scott Announces his Resignation

City Manager Shayne Scott has announced his intent to resign. His letter of resignation will become effective February 6, 2023. The Mayor and City Council intend to designate *City Finance Director, Dean Storey* as the Administrative Officer to perform the duties of the City Manager at the January 19, 2023 City Council Meeting to fill the position temporarily.

Mayor Tran provided the following statement: “The Council and I thank Mr. Scott for serving the City of Kaysville for the past 6-1/2 years. His dedication and commitment to Kaysville is evident in the leadership of our departments. We wish Mr. Scott the best in his new position as Summit County Manager.”

City Manager Scott provided the following statement: “Working in Kaysville the past 6-1/2 years has been the highlight of my profession and in many ways my personal life as well. I am so grateful for this position and my time in Kaysville and what we have been able to do together since 2016. I know it is times and opportunities like this where I will really grow as a person and I believe that our staff and community will also grow in new and interesting ways with a new City Manager as well.”
