2024 Sexual Assault Offense Reporting

Prepared in compliance with Utah Code § 53-25-202

Overview

This report includes data on sexual assault offenses reported to the Kaysville Police Department between January 1 and December 31, 2024, as required by Utah Code § 53-25-202. The purpose of this report is to provide transparency around reporting, investigation, and charging decisions for qualifying sexual assault offenses.

Understanding These Numbers

While these statistics reflect formal case outcomes, they do not fully capture the complexity or individual experiences associated with each report. Sexual assault can be deeply traumatic, and survivors respond in different ways. Some individuals may choose not to proceed with an investigation, while others may disengage at a later stage. In some cases, even with a thorough investigation, the evidence may not meet the legal threshold required to file charges.

The Kaysville Police Department recognizes that reporting sexual assault is a significant and often difficult step. Every report is taken seriously, and support services are offered to victims regardless of whether the case results in criminal charges.
